# Troop Organizational Chart




### BSA Organization

### Process to become a troop leader

#### Volunteer

- Complete YPT training
- Read and sign Troop Code of Conduct, Scouter Code of Conduct, Adult Camping Guide
- Complete other trainings (Drive Safely, Weather Hazards, Safe Swim Defense, Climb On Safely, Safety Afloat)

#### Committee

- Process: Complete YPT trainings, complete time as a volunteer, complete online trainings and Committee Challenge, interview with committee, submit paper application
- Expectations: attend meetings, wear uniform, seek out additional trainings

#### Scoutmasters

- As the need arises, experienced Committee members may be asked to join the Scoutmaster side
- Expectations: attend meetings, wear uniform, camp, complete Wood Badge training, seek out additional trainings



### Advancement Process

- EDGE method is used (Explain, Demonstrate, Guide, Enable)
- After camp, scouts follow the advancement process to complete their rank requirements.
  - The scout learns.
  - The scout is tested.
  - The scout is reviewed.
  - The scout is recognized.





### Camping



#### Costs

- Monthly 1st Weekend of Every Month, (with exceptions)
- \$13/normal campout
- Some campouts have a higher cost due to special activities (i.e. museum, cave tour, shooting, climbing, paddlecraft, camporees)

#### Food & Gear

- Patrols menu plan together
  - No extra food
  - Guidebook has an extensive explanation of Grubmaster responsibilities
- Scouts use troop gear for cooking, lanterns, tents, etc.
- Personal gear packing list (pgs. 30 31 of Guidebook)

### Camping - Process


- Sign-up Process

### Costs

- BSA Membership: \$75/year (Q4 every year)
  - New Scout one-time registration fee (\$25)
  - No cost for unit transfers
  - Order of the Arrow dues collected annually with membership
- Troop Dues: \$10/month
  - Payable annually or quarterly
  - Prorated amounts for the month you join
- Campout Fees (\$13/normal campout)
- Summer Camp, Winter Camp, & other Council camps
- High Adventure
- Automated payment options available. Save card securely on Wave & fill out the troops' online credit card auto-payment permission form>







- •Only used when messages are not for the youth



- •Primary youth communication (the PLCs also use GroupMe for fast communication)





















